Syllabus SYST 699/OR 699 Masters Program Final Project Course Fall 2015

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Course Objectives: This course serves as the synthesis activity for students completing a masters degree in Operations Research (OR 699) or Systems Engineering (SYST 699). Students will complete a major applied and realistic project in their field. Work will be done in small groups. Depending on the nature of the problem, the groups will be comprised of a combination of operations researchers and systems engineers in the proportions appropriate to the problem at hand. The students will prepare a comprehensive final report to the study sponsor, as well as a briefing to the sponsor and the entire SEOR department faculty. Regular in-progress review sessions in which students will report their progress will be held.
